


There are two kinds of people. One kind likes to get up early in the morning. The other kind likes to stay in bed.



Use of simple Present tense

- To express general truth, it means that something was true in the past, is true in the present, and will probably be true in the future.
 Water consists of Hydrogen and oxygen
- To express habitual action or repeated activity
 She wakes up at five every morning
 I usually go to campus every Monday and Tuesday
- To describe schedule or program in near future
 The train leaves Tasikmalaya at seven tonight
